) was subsequently adopted in Virginia. In 2000, the General Assembly, after considering the Virginia Model Statute and the Judges' Code, enacted a "General Statutes of Virginia" and "The Virginia Code." The General Assembly has amended the Virginia Model Statute only once, in 2004. While the Virginia General Assembly has thus consistently amended the Virginia Model Statute, the Virginia Code has undergone little change since its enactment in 1776. It is thus appropriate to interpret the Virginia Code as the law of Virginia. In addition, the Virginia Code is not as readily understood as the Virginia Model Statute. The Virginia Code was adopted at a time when the Common Law was the law of Virginia, and unsurprisingly, the Virginia Code differs from the Virginia Model Statute in its treatment of rules of construction, including the Commonwealth's right to a jury instruction on rules of construction, and 2d92ce491b
